Dissertation Title: *Expertise, Ethical Perception & Empathy in Aristotle, Merleau-Ponty and Medical Ethics*

Dissertation Abstract:

In his ethical works, Aristotle describes the practically wise person (the *phronimos*) as an expert in moral attention and action. I am interested in how this account might inform more ethical empathic relations with others – especially in the context of bioethics. On the basis of Aristotle’s description of the *phronimos*, I offer an account of empathy as emotional attentiveness informed by a kind of expertise similar to what we acquire in learning a practical skill. Cultivating expertise in empathy involves developing habits of attention that enable us to notice other peoples’ emotional cues. Crucially, this development this requires meaningful relationships with others, an awareness of the limits of our own perspectives, and an openness to learning from and being corrected by others – relational dimensions I elucidate using Maurice Merleau-Ponty’s work on interpersonal development, and insights from feminist care ethics. This account is meaningful for bioethics, I argue, since developing empathic expertise can inform better patient-physician relations and diagnostic insightfulness.
